As we enter the season of gratitude, I wanted to let you know how thankful I am for your generosity. Once we safely reopened post COVID-19 quarantine, our ReStore surpassed four years of sales records from July-September and community recycle and reuse donations at Lebanon's first city-wide garage sale included 36 cars! The boom in retail sales helped us retain and grow our staff. We are also grateful to the United Way of Linn, Benton, and Lincoln counties for \$5,000 in programmatic support toward unanticipated costs that resulting from COVID-19.

New Home Repair Program Launch

To improve housing stability and increase opportunities for homeowners to remain in their existing home and communities, we've launched the **Home Repair and Preservation Program** for homes located within Linn county, in these zip codes: 97355, 97327, 97386, 97345, and 97329. If interested, complete our Home Repair and Preservation Program Interest Form on our website's **Our Programs** page for more details about this low income qualifying loan program. If you know someone who does not have internet, please contact us at 541.405.5213 and our executive program assistant will complete the inquiry form with you over the phone. We would like to thank the following for providing funding: a Ford Foundation grant of \$5,759 allowed us to purchase a box container truck to pick up donated materials and haul materials to and from home build and repair sites. And Meyer Memorial Trust awarded us \$83,500, dispersed over two years to serve our communities in need of critical home repairs.



New Home Builds

We are excited to begin construction on the first of two or more homes from donated land in Sodaville. After sending applications to nearly 80 applicants for the September 30, 2020 deadline, our Lebanon Area Habitat for Humanity Partner Selection Committee will review submissions and make a final selection. Our partner family will contribute sweat equity, complete financial literacy courses, and pay an affordable mortgage. A common misconception is Habitat gives away homes. Our motto of giving a hand up, not a handout, contributes to helping families gain a sense of ownership and pride in their home. Calling All Volunteers

How do we accomplish all these home build and repair tasks? You! We have a unique list of tasks that should fit your entire *family and/or work group. Please complete our Volunteer Interest Form to let us know what you'd like to do to help, what days and times, and any special accommodations you may need, and we'll contact you for our next Volunteer Training session, held remotely and, if still allowable, in person following social distancing, mask wearing, and indoor meeting number limits. *In recognition of federal labor laws regarding children and the potential risk to children's safety on a construction site, no one under the age of 16 is allowed on a construction site whil construction is in progress. Also, no one under the age of 18 can do any ultra-hazardous activities, which includes the use of power tools or motor vehicles, demolitions, roofing, or working from a height of six feet or more or on excavation operations.

Our Building a Better Future capital campaign is responding to the need for more low-income housing in East Linn county. We aim to raise \$250,000 to purchase a larger Habitat ReStore as we have outgrown our downtown location. Proceeds from the sale of new and used ReStore goods support our home build programs. In addition to more sales space, a larger ReStore will create more jobs, house storage for materials used in construction projects, a volunteer training center, and more space for cleaning and testing donated items. It will also enable us to increase our recycling program, allowing for a secure dropoff area for large appliances and metals. Many grant foundations that help with capital campaigns want to see there is community

interest and involvement, so please consider completing our Volunteer Interest Form and offering an end of year donation to help broaden our work and make a lasting impact on our community.
